Places the Shinagawa Tourism Association Recommends for Fall Colors

Enjoying Autumn in Japai

Shinagawa City has many parks rich in natural scenery and perfect for a leisurely stroll. This is the time of year to enjoy the autumn colors of various trees such as maple and gingko. In this issue, we introduce four city parks with stunning fall displays.





A Japanese Strolling Garden with Brilliant Red Fall Colors

Togoshi Park

This municipal park was created from the garden on grounds that once belonged to a daimyo (feudal lord). A new municipal facility in the park called ECORU Togoshi is a wonderful place for learning about the environment, and serves as a spot for relaxation and friendly exchanges.

The maples in the center of the park display their autumn colors every year from late November through early December, and there are also special night lights.

Location: 2-1-30 Yutakacho

Access: About a seven-minute walk from Togoshi-koen Station or Shimo-shinmei Station on the Tokyu Oimachi Line.




A Japanese garden is modeled after natural scenery, such as mountains and rivers, and created with rocks, flowing water, plants and trees. Two other characteristics are its curved lines and asymmetry. A strolling garden is a type of Japanese garden that you can enjoy while going on an excursion. If the garden has a pond in the center, it's called a strolling pond garden.




Oi Central Seaside Park

Oi Central Seaside Park is a spacious metropolitan park that includes two areas known as Sports Forest and Nagisa Forest. Nagisa Forest has a manmade beach along a spacious waterway surrounded by natural greenery, where you can enjoy activities such as bird-watching as well.







Ikedayama Park

The municipal park's landscape design incorporates the natural topography with differences in elevation so that you can enjoy the view of the pond from high ground. The lower area is built for strolls around the pond. The autumn colors here are at their peak from late November through early December.

Location: 5-4-35 Higashi-Gotanda


Access: About a fifteen-minute walk from JR Gotanda

Station or Meguro Station.

Hours: 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (During July and August, 7:30

a.m. to 6:00 p.m.)

Closed: During the year-end/New Year's holidays (from December 29 through January 3)



Rinshi no Mori Park

This park was built on the former site of the testing grounds of Japan's Forestry Agency, a forestry research institute. Enjoy the autumn colors of various trees from across Japan and overseas here on a spacious expanse that

stretches across nearly twelve hectares of land.

Location: 2-6-11 Koyamadai

Access: About a ten-minute walk from Musashi-Koyama Station on the Tokyu Meguro Line.

About COVID-19 Vaccinations

(information current as of October 28)

Concerning Omicron-targeting Vaccines

The city is now administering omicron-targeting (BA.4/5) vaccines.

Eligibility: Residents twelve years of age or older who have completed the initial vaccinations (first and second injections).

Note: Currently, the omicron-targeting vaccine is limited to one injection per person.

- You can receive this vaccination if three months have passed since your last injection (second through fourth injections).
- · Vaccination tickets were mailed on October 20 to those who have completed up to the fourth injection of the previous vaccines. As soon as you receive your vaccination ticket, you can receive the omicrontargeting vaccine from the day after three months have passed since your previous vaccination.

COVID-19 Vaccination Infants and Toddlers

Vaccinations are scheduled to begin for infants and toddlers from six months to four years of age. Details such as when vaccination tickets will be mailed out will be announced in this bulletin and in the Shinagawa City website as soon as they become definite.

Promote a Sustainable Society to Ensure the Clean and Rich Future

Waste If Burned...Recyclable If Sorted

To keep the spirit of *mottainai* (don't be wasteful) in mind and develop a truly sustainable society, we need to promote these "3R" activities: (1) reduce the amount of waste at the source; (2) reuse items whenever possible; and (3) sort and recycle items as recyclable resources. Work on these 3Rs in your daily life!

Reduce Waste – Minimize It at the Source

- Try not to buy items you don't really need and disposable products
- Do not waste food
- Eat emergency food before the expiration dates and buy the necessary amount

■ Reuse Items — Use Items until They Wear Out

- Repair broken items and continue using them
- Give items that you no longer need to people who need them

Recycle—Sort and Put Out Recyclable Resources

 When you dispose of things you no longer want or need, please sort your items according to the rules.

The National Pension System: Everyone Supports Each Other

The National Pension system is a system to help each other in preparation for living of old age, in case of disability or when breadwinner family passed away. The premiums you pay support the elderly and those in difficult situations.

The Pension System

Everyone between the ages of 20 and 59 living in Japan must enroll in the National Pension system.

Registered foreign residents are also required to enroll. The premiums you pay can be deducted from your taxable income. If you are employed in a company in Japan that has an employee pension system, you are required to enroll in it. The company will complete the enrollment procedures.

There are 3 types of members:

- Category 1 insured person: This category includes the self-employed, students, part-time workers, the unemployed, etc. Pension premiums are ¥16,590 per month (FY2022) and must be paid by the member himself/herself.
- Category 2 insured person: This category includes company employees and public employees who are enrolled in an employee pension system or mutual benefit society. Pension premiums are deducted from their salaries.
- Category 3 insured person: This category refers to dependent spouses of category 2 insured persons. Since the pension plan of the category 2 insured person covers the pension premiums, there is no need for the spouse to pay individually.

When You Receive Pension Benefits

Old-Age Basic Pension

As a rule, under the current system, when you turn 65 years of age and if the sum of the following periods listed in (1) through (3) below is ten years or more, you can receive an elderly pension benefit:

(1) Period that pension premiums were paid (including

- the period that you were a category 2 insured person)
- (2) Period that you were a category 3 insured person
- (3) Pension premium exemption period, special payment exception period for students, and contribution postponement period (grace period) for low income youth

Note: There are also other pension programs, such as the Disability Basic Pension, Survivors' Basic Pension, widow's pension, and lump-sum death benefit, each with their own eligibility requirements, such as the payment period of pension premiums.

Lump-Sum Withdrawal Payment System

Foreign residents who leave Japan without fulfilling the requirements for receiving a pension can still receive a lump-sum benefit if they have paid pension premiums for six months or longer, and if they file an application within two years after leaving Japan.

Complete the Designated Procedures in the Following Cases

You need to file an application to enroll in the system, receive pension benefits, and complete other procedures. Please do not forget to file these applications and other notifications.

- If you leave a company that has an employee pension system (or is a mutual benefit society member) before you reach 60 years of age: Please complete the designated procedures at the City Office.
- O If you are no longer a category 3 insured person (dependent spouse): If you do not enroll in an employee pension, please complete the designated procedures at the City Office.
- ☐ If you move overseas (excluding category 2 and 3

- **insured persons):** If you file a notification that you are moving out of the country into your resident record, you will lose eligibility for the National Pension.
- O If you move into the city from overseas (excluding category 2 and 3 insured persons): Please complete the designated procedures at the City Office

Note: When you reach 20 years of age, the Japan Pension Service Office will send you information on how to enroll in the national pension system.

Please Ask for Advice

- O If you are having difficulty paying your pension premiums, please be aware that there are exemptions and grace period systems you may be able use depending on your income status. You can apply for these dating back up to two years and one month before you submit your application.
- O If you receive a disability pension (grade 1 or 2), there are programs to exempt your pension premiums.
- O Those who give birth in or after February 2019 must apply for a pension premium exemption.
- O For those whose pension premium payment period or enrollment period is less than ten years or who cannot fulfill other pension benefit requirements, it may be possible to extend enrollment in the National Pension even after reaching 60 years of age.
