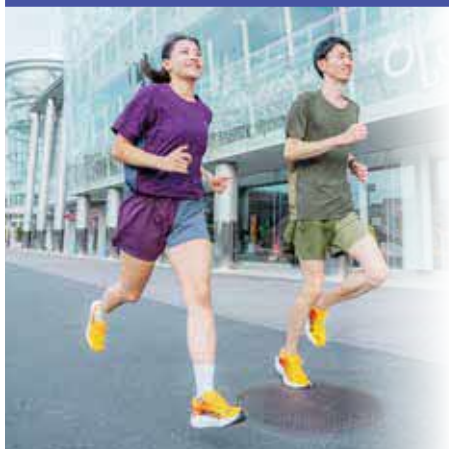

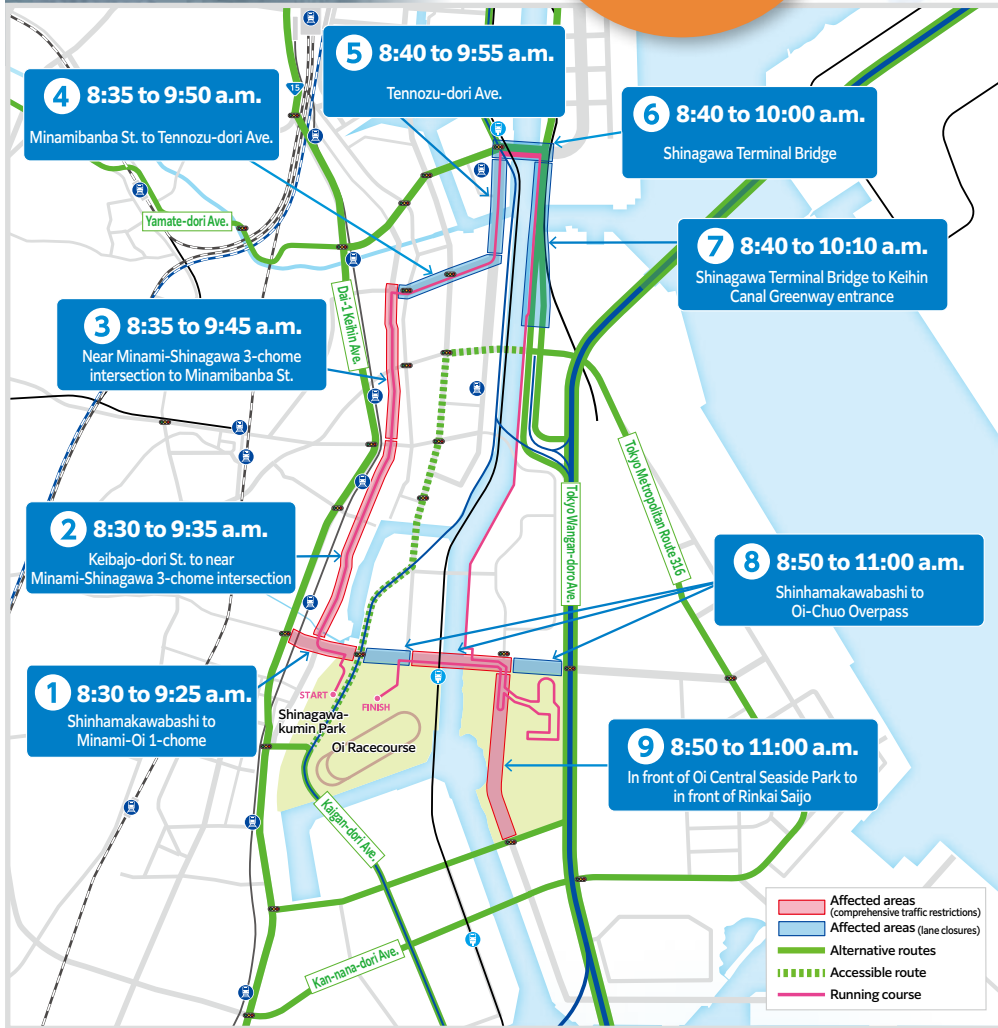


Shinagawa City Run 2025

The Shinagawa City Run is a brand-new event that according to the city aims to “make Shinagawa City shine with the smiles of its residents through the power of sports.” Any local resident can participate in the event as a runner, volunteer or spectator, and every resident can shine.

The goals of this event—which is making its debut in 2025—is to promote Shinagawa City and foster pride among its residents.

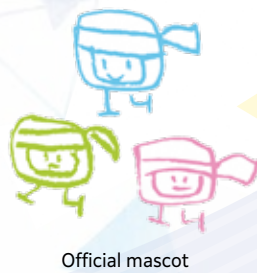

Now Accepting Declarations for Special City Resident's Tax/ Metropolitan Resident's Tax

We will begin accepting declarations for resident's tax in FY2025 soon. Please submit your application by postal mail whenever possible.

Dates: February 17 (Mon.) through March 17 (Mon.), 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Notes:

1. Excludes Saturdays and national holidays
2. Open until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesdays

Location: Meeting Room 141, Shinagawa City Office (Hon Chosha 4F)

Note: Returns are also accepted at the Tax Section service counter (Hon Chosha 4F) from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesdays and from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.

Eligibility: You must be a Shinagawa City resident as of January 1, 2025 who has not submitted an income tax return to the tax office and meet any of the following requirements:

- Did not have any income during the period between January 1 and December 31, 2024, and was not reported as a spouse eligible for tax deductions, a person of the same livelihood, or a dependent of a Shinagawa City resident taxpayer.
- Had an income during the period between January 1 and December 31, 2024 other than a salary or pension.
- Had an income during the period between January 1 and December 31, 2024, but your employer has not submitted a salary payment report to Shinagawa City.

Notes:

1. FY2025 special city resident's tax/metropolitan resident's tax report forms were mailed on February 4 (Tue.), based on records for the previous year. If you have not received a form and need one, please contact the office below.
2. You cannot obtain a tax payment/taxation/tax exemption certificate unless you file an income report. Not filing an income report can also affect the calculation of your National Health Insurance premiums and the use of other administrative services.

● Exemptions for dependents living abroad

You must meet at least one of the following requirements to claim exemptions for dependents between the ages of 30 and 69 who live outside Japan:

1. Dependent must not have an address or place of residence within Japan due to study abroad (A copy of the equivalent of a visa or residence card in foreign countries must be submitted)
2. Dependent is disabled
3. Dependent living abroad received ¥380,000 or more from you for his/her livelihood or education expenses (you must submit remittance certificate references)
